

Haiti 180 Mission Trip Rules:

1. Be respectful to all staff, children, and community members and follow staff instructions
2. No complaining
3. Be flexible
4. No drugs or alcohol
5. No distribution of **ANY** type of donations- money or goods. All donations/goods must be given to Emmanuel, our director to distribute accordingly
6. Men and women must sleep in designated rooms unless approved otherwise by hospitality coordinator
7. No romantic behavior
8. No kids allowed on 2nd floor or roof unless staff has brought them up for special programs
9. Limited internet use
10. Conserve water with showering and toilet use
11. Be conscious of the amount of food you take, don't waste food
12. Dress modestly at all times, especially when swimming/bathing (NO bikinis)
13. Respect the dignity of the children and community members when taking pictures as well as when sharing them with friends and family

While missionaries are not required to be Catholic, all missionaries must live by Catholic morals while working with Haiti 180 as it is a Catholic mission. Team members do not need to participate in prayer, but must be present and respectful for all activities. If a team member's dress is found to be inappropriate, that individual will be asked to change. If any team members are found to be using drugs or alcohol or engaging in sexual activity they will be sent home, with all expenses paid by that individual.

Haiti 180 has the right to refuse missionaries based on their conduct on previous mission trips, and will always act in the best interest of our children. This mission is first to serve God, then to serve orphans and the community. We welcome and are grateful for missionary groups, but must put the good of the children and community first. We thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
